# "Fund price" Website – 4 Frequently Used Functions User Guide (Desktop website version)

The new 'Fund Price' interface is now available on the Manulife Hong Kong website for comparison and analysis of funds/investment choices.


Equipped with the 4 new and enhanced functions so you can find the information you need, faster than ever.






#### 1.Search function - Look for the funds/investment choices you need






In the search bar (green box), enter keywords or codes related to the fund/investment choice to reveal search results at once.



Click on other tabs (blue box) such as 'Performance-cumulative' or 'Performance-calendar year' for further information directly on your search results.


## 2. Filter function – Shorten search time and promptly shortlist the funds/investment choices according to filter criteria



The filter function (green box) allows you to set your own filter criteria, such as risk class/level and asset class to narrow down funds/investment choices for your better comparison.



#### 3. Sort Function - Swiftly sort data in ascending or descending order





By clicking on the tabs (blue box) and sorting buttons on the right of the data columns (green box), sort information in ascending or descending order for a clear glance.



#### Smart Tip 1: 'Filter', then 'Sort'

By combining the 'filter' and 'sort' functions, sort funds/investment choices of the same category according to their performance or other attributes during a chosen period more effectively.

For example, to view the better performing funds/investment choices under same 'Asset class' in 2021, such as 'Equity' or 'Bond'.

- 1. In the 'Filter' settings, choose the 'Asset Class', such as 'Equity' or 'Bond'
- 2. Under the 'Performance- calendar year' tab, sort column '2021' in descending order to view.




#### Smart Tip 2: 'Search', then 'Sort'

Use the 'Search' and 'Sort' functions together to easily sort chosen funds/investment choices according to performance or other attributes within a certain period.


For example, to view the better performing equity funds or bond funds since launch.

- 1. Enter keyword 'equity fund' or "bond fund" in the search bar
- 2. Under the 'Performance- cumulative' tab, sort the 'Since launch/ launch date' column in descending order to view.

### 4.Fund/Investment Choice Comparison Function




Tick up to 5 funds/investment choices (green box) to compare.



By hovering your mouse over the price chart, view fund prices of the selected funds/investment choices of the chosen date (green box) in the past with ease.







Chosen funds/investment choices are also listed by 'Cumulative' or 'Calendar year' performance (green box), so you can view past performances at one glance.



Smart Tip 3: Lock, then Compare

After using the 'Search', 'Filter' or 'Sort' functions to lock and choose the funds/investment choices you would like to compare, utilise the 'Performance-cumulative' and "Performance-calendar year" tabs to analyse information details side by side.

For example, to compare fund/investment choice performances side by side.

- 1. Using the 'Search', 'Filter', or 'Sort' functions, tick the better performing funds/investment choices in the past '5 years'.
- 2. Compare them to view their details and performance.
