Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide long term capital growth by investing in a portfolio of Hong Kong SAR shares, while promoting environmental, social and governance (ESG) characteristics. The Fund qualifies under Article 8 of SFDR.

Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed. In normal market conditions, the Fund will invest at least 90% of its assets in shares (or securities similar to shares) of companies of any size that are based in or carry out the larger part of their business activities in, Hong Kong SAR. The Fund includes the identification and analysis of a company's ESG Credentials as an integral part of the investment decision making process to reduce risk and enhance returns. The Fund will not invest in companies with involvement in specific excluded activities, such as: companies involved in the production of controversial weapons and tobacco; companies with more than 10% revenue generated from thermal coal extraction; and companies with more than 10% revenue generated from coal-fired power generation. The Fund can invest up to 20% in China A and China B-shares, up to 10% in other funds and up to 10% Real Estate Investment Trusts. 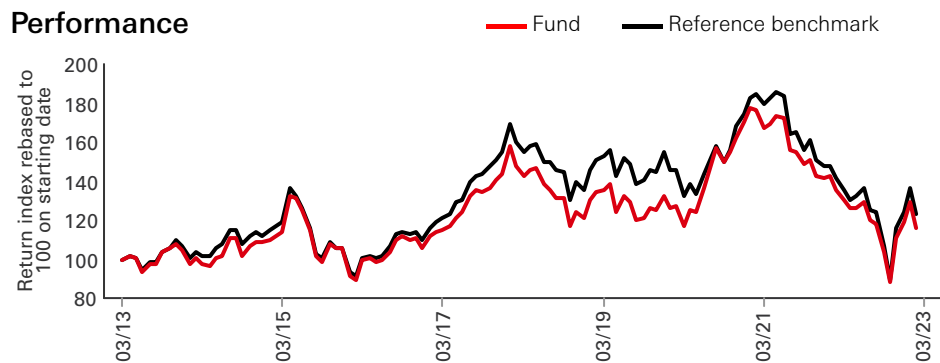

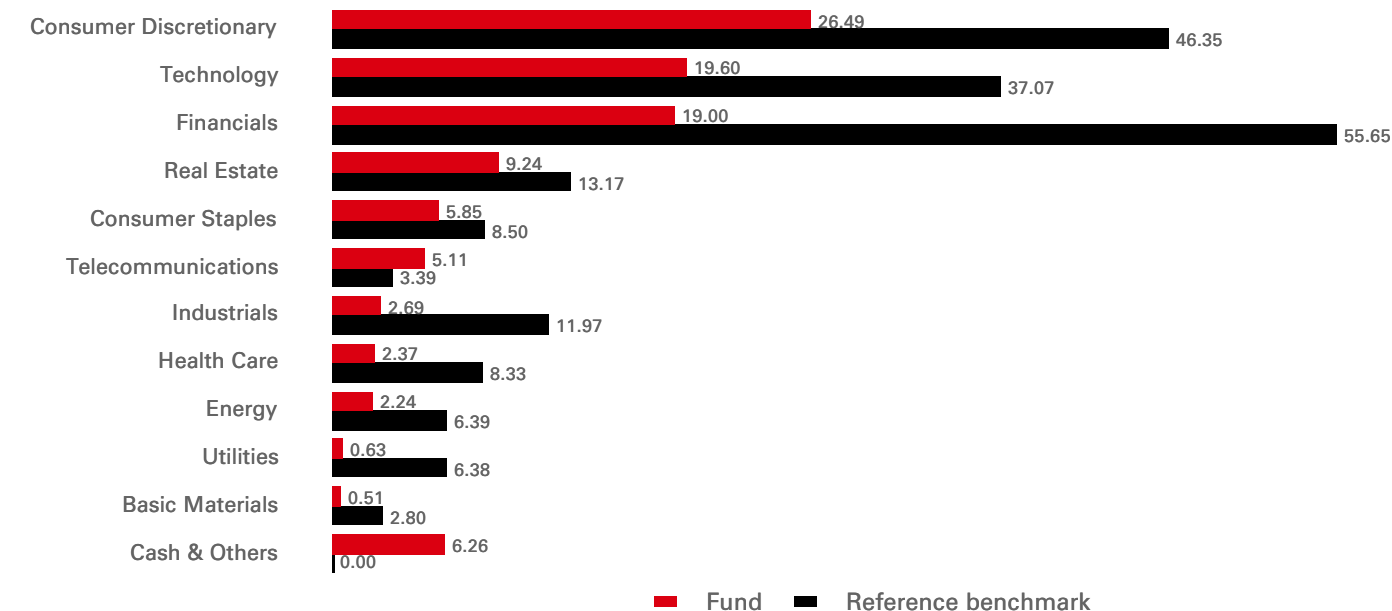

Monthly performance commentary

Stock selection was negative for the month. Positive performance came from Real Estate and Consumer Staples, though this was offset by negative stock selection in Technology and Telecommunications.

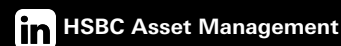
Financials security, HSBC with total effect 0.56% is the top contributor. Additionally, Consumer Discretionary security, NetEase was the second largest contributor with total effect 0.13%. Consumer Discretionary security, Alibaba also contributed with total effect 0.12%.

On the other side, detractors include Health Care security Wuxi Biologics with total effect -0.18%, Financials holding CICC with total effect -0.11% and Telecommunications holding China Mobile with total effect -0.10%.

During this period, positions were initiated in China Communications Construction, Jiangxi Copper, SMIC, Longfor Group and Beigene. Positions were closed in JD.com, Wuxi AppTec, Swire Pacific, Samsonite International and Kingdee International.

Sector allocation effects are residual to stock selection. At the sector level, effects were positive, given an underweight exposure to Financials.

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Glossary



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Benchmark disclosure

The Investment Advisor will use its discretion to invest in securities not included in the reference benchmark based on active investment management strategies and specific investment opportunities. It is foreseen that a significant percentage of the Fund's investments will be components of the reference benchmark. However, their weightings may deviate materially from those of the reference benchmark. Any deviations with respect to the benchmark are monitored within a comprehensive risk framework, which includes monitoring at security and sector level. The deviation of the Fund's performance relative to the benchmark is monitored, but not constrained, to a defined range. The reference benchmark has a high level of concentration. This means that a small number of securities make up a significant proportion of the benchmark.

Annually distribution is 1; semi-annually distribution is 2; quarterly distribution is 4; monthly distribution is 12.
The annualised dividend yield is calculated based on the dividend distribution on the relevant date with dividend reinvested, and may be higher or lower than the actual annual dividend yield.
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
