Manulife renews sponsorship of Manulife Centre for Children with Specific Learning Disabilities at The Hong Kong Polytechnic University

This marks Manulife's 18th year of longstanding support to children with specific learning disabilities

Hong Kong — Manulife has renewed its sponsorship for the Manulife Centre for Children with Specific Learning Disabilities (MCCSLD) at The Hong Kong Polytechnic University (PolyU), pledging a further HK\$2.65 million to continue the Company's 18-year-long commitment to helping children with specific learning disabilities (SLD).

SLD affects about 12.6% of children aged between six and 10 years in Hong Kong^l. Children with SLD generally have weaker cognitive abilities in relation to reading and writingⁱⁱ. Through the Manulife Charitable Foundation, Manulife has sponsored the MCCSLD since 1999 in support of its mandate to undertake research for the identification of SLD children in need of special assistance and to provide professional services that help them develop their full potential through various activities.

"Our future generations are our greatest asset, and we care deeply about their development and well-being," said Guy Mills, Chief Executive Officer, Manulife Hong Kong. "Many children with SLD do have great potential for excellence. All they need is some guidance and extra attention to stimulate their best efforts. We hope that through supporting the great work of MCCSLD, a leading institution in this field, we can help these children realize their full potential."

Activities organized by the MCCSLD focus on dynamic interaction with SLD children to fulfill their multifaceted potential. The donations from Manulife to support the MCCSLD total more than HK\$15 million, allowing it to conduct more than 400 seminars, workshops and training programmes for some 10,000 children with various educational special needs and about 6,000 parents of SLD children.

Dr. Alice Lai, Director of the MCCSLD, thanked Manulife for its ongoing support: "I am very delighted to celebrate another milestone in our partnership and friendship with Manulife. Over the past 18 years, our Centre has witnessed a tremendous growth in the services we are able to provide, and there is also a noticeable increase in both the public and the authorities' awareness about the difficulties faced by children with learning disorder.
